

Marvell Foods' President Marilyn Raybin Appears on Forbes '50 Over 50' List

Women In Food And Agriculture Forbes 50 Over 50 Marvell Foods

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Marilyn Raybin, President of Marvell Foods, has been named to the Forbes '50 Over 50' list that highlights women over the age of 50 who are changing the world.

The list features 200 women showcased in four categories: Lifestyle, Impact, Innovation and Investment. Raybin was featured in the lifestyle category, defined as "Visionaries reshaping entertainment and culture."

Raybin was recognized for co-founding Marvell Foods in 2007 and helping it grow into one of the top companies in the foodservice space. She bought out her partner in 2010 at 60 years old.

In 2023, under Raybin's eye, the company works with some of the top names in the space, including 7-11, Martha Stewart and Nestle.

Raybin has an impressive story behind the success she has witnessed in the last decade or so. Forbes shared that she is the daughter of a Polish Holocaust survivor, who went on to own a meatpacking plant in the Bronx, NY.

With a family history in the meat business, she would become known as the "Chicken Queen" while she served as the lone woman for MRD Foods in 1998.

Mika Brzezinski best-selling author, co-host of MSNBC's Morning Joe and a partner on the third annual '50 Over 50 list, wrote, "The result is a group of people whose collective power—literally—stretches from the deep sea to outer space. We can only hope that you will be as inspired by reading their stories as we are in sharing them."

Raybin was featured alongside R&B legend Patti LaBelle, who started her own food line, author Judy Blume and Oscar-winning actress Jamie Lee Curtis.
